This Term is gearing up to be a busy one as we have last excursions and finishing up of work. Not sure where this year has gone but I am looking forward to the warmer weather.

Bowls: Today was the last bowls lesson, which I was able to attend, together with the Ungarra School. It was a lovely day!



Lunchtime Activities I have been given 5 extra hours a week for the rest of Term 4, which will be useful. I have been coming in more at Lunchtimes to do activities with the children. This week we set up an obstacle course, played Tennis, played “the floor is lava” on the playground, bounced table tennis balls into plastic cups and made some amazing cakes in the sand pit! Last week we made puffs—puff pastry sprinkled with salt and poppy seeds—to eat at lunch time.



Classroom Help: I helped the UP's make clay models, put together their own healthy menu in HAAS and learn about Chance in Maths. I helped the LP's when they were discovering the difference between man-made and natural things in HAAS and also about whether things are likely or unlikely to occur.

Breakfast Club: So far this term we have had, Toad in the Hole (Week 1), Muesli with yoghurt and berries or English muffins (Week 2) and Weetbix Banana Muffins (Week 3). We also have juice every week.



Kimochi Time: I have talked about Friendship and what you can and can't control. Last term I read the Worry Worrier book and taught the children how to give themselves Butterfly Hugs which is a nice way to soothe yourself if anxious about things. I continue to do Kimochi's weekly on a Friday morning.
