I am the Pastoral Care Worker (PCW) at Port Neill Primary School. I am employed by Schools Ministry Group (SMG) who support young people and their communities to discover Purpose, Value and Hope. I do this through being a positive role



model at school and in the Community and help with the wellbeing and social interaction of your child with others.

In my role, I spend time and do activities with the children at Recess or Lunchtimes or assist in the Classroom, hold a Breakfast Club once a week, and have Kimochi time with the children to talk about their feelings and frustrations and help to develop empathy. I also work one-on-one with students to discuss and talk about emotional regulation or resilience, as required.
