Engaging with other schools is always a great opportunity for our students and staff to broaden their awareness, build relationships and to learn from each other, it supports our school vision of students being responsible contributors to communities.

Leaders Day and Numeracy Summit

Last Monday I attended the Education Leaders' Day in Adelaide along with Principals from across the state. The day was very interesting with the key message being 'building a world-leading education system'. Valerie Hannon, international educational researcher/futurist and Anthony McKay, global educational research and development leader were key note speakers. Discussions and learning included our collective purpose as educators, our state context, children and young people's future in a global context, and what's shaping education today. My plan is to investigate some of the learnings from the day further to see what changes we can make at PNPS to support our students current and future needs.

The Numeracy Summit was held on the Tuesday, when I returned from school I shared my learning with staff. We plan to slowly build our numeracy understandings and teaching practice through engaging in Big Ideas in Number professional development in term 2.

NAPLAN

Our year 3 & 5 students commenced NAPLAN assessments this week. They started with writing, then moved onto Reading, Conventions of Language and Numeracy. I must congratulate our students on the way they approached each assessment and the resilience they showed throughout the week.

From 2023 each student's NAPLAN report will show how they're tracking against 4 levels of achievement, known as proficiency standards. These will replace the 10 NAPLAN bands.

We are learning to create noun groups using adjectives. <u>Success Criteria:</u> I'll know I've got it when I can create my own noun group and write it in a sentence.




Kumiko and the Dragon


