
Success Criteria: I can select and show a multiplication strategy with working out to find an accurate answer. I can explain my answer to another person.

















REPEON WALLEY

<u>Lunchtimes</u>: On Tuesdays (STEM activities) the last two weeks I have done balloon rockets with the children and harmony day activities.


On Friday (Crafty Activities) I have made easy Easter bunnies with them and stress balloons.


