Hello everyone, Student Free Day

Last Tuesday, Leonie Shelley, Curriculum Lead, spent the day with us. We started the day by unpacking our school Vision statement and what skills/attributes/knowledge students need to experience/ practice in the classroom to ensure we are aligning our teaching and learning to the Vision Statement. We then moved onto connecting this to our SIP Challenge of Practice and the structure of the curriculum. Leonie facilitated teachers to reflect and talk about their current practice and how they ensure every child sees themselves in the curriculum and how community is seen through the curriculum. We unpacked the phases of learning and aligned pedagogical questioning to the phases, which will support teachers specifically with this term's focus of increasing dialogic talk in classrooms.

Staff Professional Development

Olivia and I have commenced the Orbis R-2 Literacy PD, we are in the process of writing our Applied Research project which will focus on the impact of dialogic talk in student writing.

Olivia attended the Autism Inclusion Teacher training this week and I attended the Social Ventures Australia Thought Leadership Gathering in Adelaide. I will also be attending the Central Eyre 2 Portfolio meeting in Port Lincoln on Thursday.

Eliza is participating in a PLC with other year 3-6 teachers across the Portfolio. She has been working with Gracen, Ungarra Year 3-6 teacher and a Project Officer from the Department to unpack the curriculum and plot student writing against the Literacy Progressions. Olivia, Eliza and I continue our Learning Intention/Success Criteria PLC on Thursday afternoons, which is going well.

Site Improvement Plan

This term, we are continuing with term one's focus on Learning Intentions and Success Criteria but also teachers are implementing intentional dialogic talk strategies to increase the time students are talking about their learning to further deepen their understanding and for a formative assessment strategy. Dialogic Talk underpins the Teaching and Learning Cycle.

GRIP Conference & SRC

Miss Laete and our year 5 & 6 students; Sidney, Caitlin & Estelle attended the Primary School GRIP Leadership Conference on Friday, week 1. Many thanks to Tracey Scharenberg for supporting Eliza and attending the excursion. The students all enjoyed the experience and will share their learning with SRC.
