Professional Development for Teachers

At the end of last term our teachers gathered to unpack the HASS, Science and Technologies curriculum. We dived into the key concepts of each learning area and identified links across these to assist with integration of concepts and deepening of learning experiences for students.

This week we were very excited to have Lyn Coote (Director, Professional Learning, Corwin Australia) visit classrooms and meet with teachers and myself. Lyn will work with us over a period of time to model teaching techniques and provide coaching sessions. The purpose of our work with Lyn is to enable all students to explain where they are going, how they are doing, and where to next in regard to their learning.

TESEP incursion

On Friday we will have Ungarra Upper Primary Students visit our school to learn about Wet Rocks with scientist, Phillip, from Teacher Earth Science Education (TESEP) Programme. After the sharing of information students will then travel to the Wharminda Soaks, where Peter Prime will inform students about this important part of our community. This will be a fantastic opportunity for students to connect the classroom learning with Phillip to our local community. Junior Primary students will join in the excursion to the Soaks where all students will have a sausage sizzle lunch.


