I am very proud of our year 3 and 5 students for the way they have approached this year's NAPLAN assessments. This week students have taken on the challenge of Reading and Writing assessments with a 'can do' attitude and simply got down to the tasks that needed to be done with a fantastic positive attitude. Next week, students will complete the Conventions of Language and Numeracy assessments.

Inquiry and Play-based Learning

At PNPS we are piloting Inquiry learning in our afternoons, and one of the ways we are implementing this is with a focus on Play-based Learning in the JP class. Students have been using play to create a market stall in their classroom which has led to the making of rosemary salt and learning how to design labels. Play-based learning enables children to engage in flexible and higher-level thinking processes including inquiry processes of problem solving, analysing evaluating, applying knowledge and creativity. All of these are important skills for our children to learn for them to thrive today and into their future.

Our Upper Primary students have been investigating eco-friendly homes and are able to confidently articulate the different types, why sustainable housing is important and how their learning relates to the real world. I look forward to students sharing their learning with the wider community so they can inform others and see how their learning is powerful and can have impact.

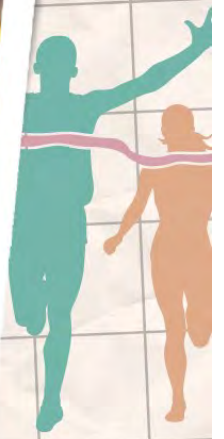

JUNIOR PRIMARY MATHS

In Maths our bluebells group have been learning to count to 1000, using place value to help recognise and order numbers. As a group we counted 1000 items! We were very busy and counted into groups of 10 so that we could work as a team to get to 1000!



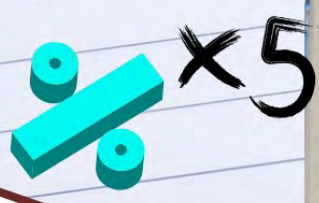


In maths we have started daily timetable practice and been investigating Number: prime and composite numbers, factors and multiples, ordering, reading and writing large numbers, and writing numbers in expanded form.

In reading we have been practicing our inferencing skills; using clues in the text to answer questions.

For Inquiry students have been researching the different types of eco-housing and investigating the design features of each one. There are 10 basic types of eco housing including rotating houses (to catch the sunlight), rammed earth houses which are fireproof, and prefab houses which only take 2 to 3 days to put together.
